




















**Weather Words**

1. Match the following pictograms with the correct word. If necessary, use a dictionary.

*sunny - snow - tornado - overcast - heavy rain - thunderstorm - hot - clear sky - hail - foggy - cold - starry night - thunder - stormy - frozen - rain showers - cloudy - Warning: icy roads! - sunny (with a chance of rain) - lightning*
